Honoring a tradition spanning seven decades, the Lithuanian Folk Dance Festival will be held next summer throughout the July 4th weekend in Philadelphia, Pa., culminating in the magnificent celebration of dance on July 3 as up to 1,500 dancers take center stage at Temple University's Liacouras Center.

As thousands gather from around the world to celebrate their Lithuanian heritage, events throughout the weekend are planned to equally engage and educate. Specifically, we are writing to you about *Karalių Kaimas*, the *Kings Village*, which will feature exposition of ideas, products, and culture all with Lithuanian roots.

We are reaching out to you to invite you exhibit in *Karalių Kaimas*, showcasing your own company's innovations and/or products. We will provide you with space in the ballroom at no cost, however we are not able to cover any special requirements such as audio-visual equipment or other technologies you require.

Located at the Philadelphia Marriott Downtown, the event hotel for the festival, *Karalių Kaimas* will generate a great deal of traffic as it will be held as part of the registration, ticket pick-up, souvenir store and is adjacent to the artisan fair. *Karalių Kaimus* will be open on Friday, July 3 and Saturday July 2.
